#### What is Palliative Care?

It Depends...

Simple Definition – "Comfort Care"

All hospice care is palliative care, not all palliative care is hospice care Short acute care

Chronic pain management

With a life limiting condition, but out of the 6-month Hospice Medicare time frame

#### What is Hospice?

- Managed Pain, Symptom Control
- Emotional and spiritual support
- Expert medical care
- Individual and family (caregiver) support
- Training and education
- Dignity at the end of life
- After care support



## Force you to give up Hope!

Require you to accept what is happening to you and your family

Stop your medications or force you to take them Stop feeding you or make you eat when you don't want to

Limit where you can go and what you can

Cost you and your family a lot financially

 Take over your medical decisions
 Speed up your or slow down your death

## Only for the last few days of life

## What do most of us want at the end of life?

- Reduced burden on our family
- To have control over health care decisions
- ► To be free of physical distress
- To reduce prolonged treatments with bad side effects
- ► To die at our own home with the people we love
- ► To die with dignity

#### Goals of Hospice Care

Comfort
Communication
Completion
Dignity



#### Why Hospice sooner rather than later?

- Support system Time to build a relationship and trust with staff and family
- Time to manage pain and provide symptom control, while bringing sensitivity, compassion and skill to meet each individual's needs
- Extra support and education
- 24/7 Availability to avoid hospitalizations and to prevent symptoms from getting worse which often causes them
